Ilkka Paananen and Niklas Zennström join the jury for The Bank of Åland's Baltic Sea Project

Ilkka Paananen, CEO for the gaming company Supercell, joins the Baltic Sea Project's jury for digital innovations. Skype co-founder Niklas Zennström joined the jury earlier this autumn. This year, the Baltic Sea Project provides a total of 400.000 euros in funding for projects that help the Baltic Sea. The project also launches a new category for digital innovations.

For that to happen, we need to join forces with others, and this award is a great platform to do that, **Niklas Zennström** says.
